



General Information on Structure for ETV ONLINE Teacher Recertification Courses

ETV Teacher Recertification courses are provided by ETV Education for South Carolina educators and approved for renewal credit by the SC Department of Education Office of Educator Services. NO graduate credit is available.

ETV Online Teacher Recertification courses for 20 renewal credits (Annenberg and Other ETV courses):

- All 20 renewal credit courses are provided online in five, 6 to 8 week-long sessions: FALL, WINTER, SPRING I, SPRING II, and SUMMER.
- All 20 renewal credit courses are self-paced and facilitated online at [ETVLearn](#). ETVLearn utilizes Moodle as the course management system in which these courses are housed.

- All 20 renewal credit courses contain between 8-16 video lessons each, which equals approximately 8-10 hours of viewing time. For the courses that include Annenberg videos, the link to access the video lesson will take you to the Annenberg site to view the video lesson. Be sure to come back to the [ETV Course site](#) to answer the discussion topic question.
- After viewing each video lesson online, you then respond to a discussion topic question about that video lesson(s) in that topic. You are required to write a discussion topic response of approximately 100 words (some topics vary from the standard and you are directed to either limit response to less than 100 words or there is no length requirement).
- The courses are *self-paced*. You do not have weekly deadlines so you may work at your own pace at any time of day, even completing before the END date of the session if you desire. Your only deadline is to complete ALL work and the final evaluation by the END date of the session.
- As you view video lessons and post your discussion topic responses, your viewing is monitored and your responses are reviewed/rated by the course facilitator on a pass/fail basis. A rating of “1” = pass; “0” = fail. The facilitator will email you if your post is not acceptable. If you complete several lessons at once, please know our facilitator approves them as quickly as possible.
- During the course, you are also encouraged to respond to other class participant’s discussion topic posts. This makes the online course more interactive and interesting!
- Once you complete all course work successfully by the designated END date of the session, you must complete a simple final evaluation to provide your valued input on the course (this is the next to last topic in each course). This is mandatory. The ETV Learn system will not unlock your certificate of completion nor report you as a completer if you do not complete the final evaluation for each course.
- Once we check off that you have completed the final evaluation, your certificate of completion is unlocked. (the certificate is the last topic section in each course). You can access the course site even after your session has ended if you need to print your certificate again.
*** NOTE: The date you first access the *certificate* is the date that prints on the certificate as the completion date so please access your certificate immediately upon completing the evaluation.**
- In order to receive renewal credits, it is your responsibility to provide a copy of any awarded course certificate(s) of completion to SDE Office of Educator Services if you are not employed by a district. If you are employed, you must provide a copy of the certificate to your school district.

- ETV Education will send a Completion List to verify participant achievement to the SDE Office of Educator Services within 10 working days after the course END date.

ETV Teacher Recertification ONLINE courses for 60 renewal credits:

- Currently, the only 60 renewal credit course offered is *Natural History In and Out of the Classroom with Rudy Mancke*. (NO graduate credit)
- This course is only offered in FALL (September – December) and WINTER (January- April) sessions. We must have 10 enrolled in a session to provide the course.
- Course is self-paced, but there are four deadlines during the session when you must turn in assignments. See the synopsis on the course page for requirements and deadlines.
- The video lessons and assignments are facilitated **online** and there is a REQUIRED face-to-face final class meeting in Columbia at the end of the course (held on a Saturday morning).

The Arts and Career Connections, Series I

This professional development course uses video resources developed by the SC Department of Education and South Carolina ETV to support arts educators, school guidance and career specialist professionals, and regular classroom teachers. It can be valuable to all educators who seek to know more about the arts and career possibilities in arts fields in order to share this knowledge with their students as they help guide them in their focus of studies and prepare them for higher education or entering the world of work. (Recommended for teachers of all grade levels)

The programs in this course look at the history of arts education in South Carolina in terms of legislation, initiatives and lessons learned; provide discussions with a variety of arts professionals who address 21st century skills as they relate what they do in their jobs day to day; give an in-depth look at several of these professionals with outstanding and interesting careers; and take us behind-the-scenes to learn about the lives and work of some famous artists with South Carolina connections.

DIRECTIONS: (Read IMPORTANT information below and complete Participant Profile Survey before you begin!)

Participants will view video lessons online and then post response to discussion topic questions by clicking "add a new discussion topic" in on-line forum. (Each response should be at least 100 words.)

Once you have written your response in the block, be sure to click "Post to Forum" bullet so it will be posted for facilitator to rate. (Rating of " = pass)

Participants are encouraged to read and respond to discussion posts from other participants in the course, making the course more interactive and interesting. However, be sure to post your own response, not just respond to other participant(s) so your work will show up in the reporting system under your name, allowing facilitator to know it is posted to review.

Participants will complete viewing of video lessons, discussion topic responses and then final course evaluation questions by designated session end date. Once reporting system indicates you have viewed all video lessons and completed discussion topic responses successfully, your final evaluation questions will unlock for you to access. Once we check off that you have completed the questions to provide input on course, your certificate of completion will unlock for you to print. (Keep copy for your files.)

Once all coursework is reviewed/rated, the final evaluation will unlock for you to answer five questions, giving your input on the course.

Once we check off that you have answered the final evaluation questions, your certificate of completion will unlock for you to print it.

IMPORTANT: Please print your certificate of completion by at least two weeks after the session ends because the date accessed is the date that will be printed on the certificate and, once we close out the session, you will no longer be able to get into Moodle system to print it.

PLEASE be patient. It may take several days after course ends for your facilitator to sign off on all of your course work.

Viewing Videos Problems

If your video segments are slow, stuck or buffering, it's very possible that your directories of "temporary internet files" and RAM (sometimes known as "cache") are close to the maximum and just cannot take anymore, the end result being any of the above scenarios or videos that: A) come to a complete freeze; B) start/stop/start/stop in a choppy way; or C) never even make it onto your screen. Here are some things you can try to see if you can get your computer to cooperate:

- Allow the video segment to load completely, or at least halfway, before you start to watch it.
- Close all windows that you don't need. Having too many windows open will slow the loading process.
- Go to your internet browser and clear/delete the history, temporary internet files and cookies by doing the following:
 - In **Microsoft Explorer** on the status bar at the top, click on Tools, Internet Options, on the General tab, delete Browser History, click on OK.
 - In **Firefox** click on Tools, Clear recent History. This clears the cookies out of the computer. ("Temporary internet files" are tiny bits of webpages that get permanently put on your hard-drive. They will remain forever on your computer, gradually plugging it up like hair stuck in a sink drain, until you finally get rid of them -- or "clear your cache" of "temporary internet files", "cookies", and "history").
- Also under Tools, Internet Options, under Browsing History click on Settings and make sure the cache is set to at least 250.
- Shut down the computer and reboot it.

If all that fails:

- ✓ Try a different computer, if possible.
- ✓ Try viewing the videos at a different location.
- ✓ Change your web browser – please be sure you are not confusing this with a SEARCH ENGINE.
 - **WEB BROWSER** - a program on your computer that allows you to visit websites
 - **SEARCH ENGINE** - programs that search documents for specified keywords and returns a list of the documents where the keywords were found - such as Google, Ask, or Bing.
